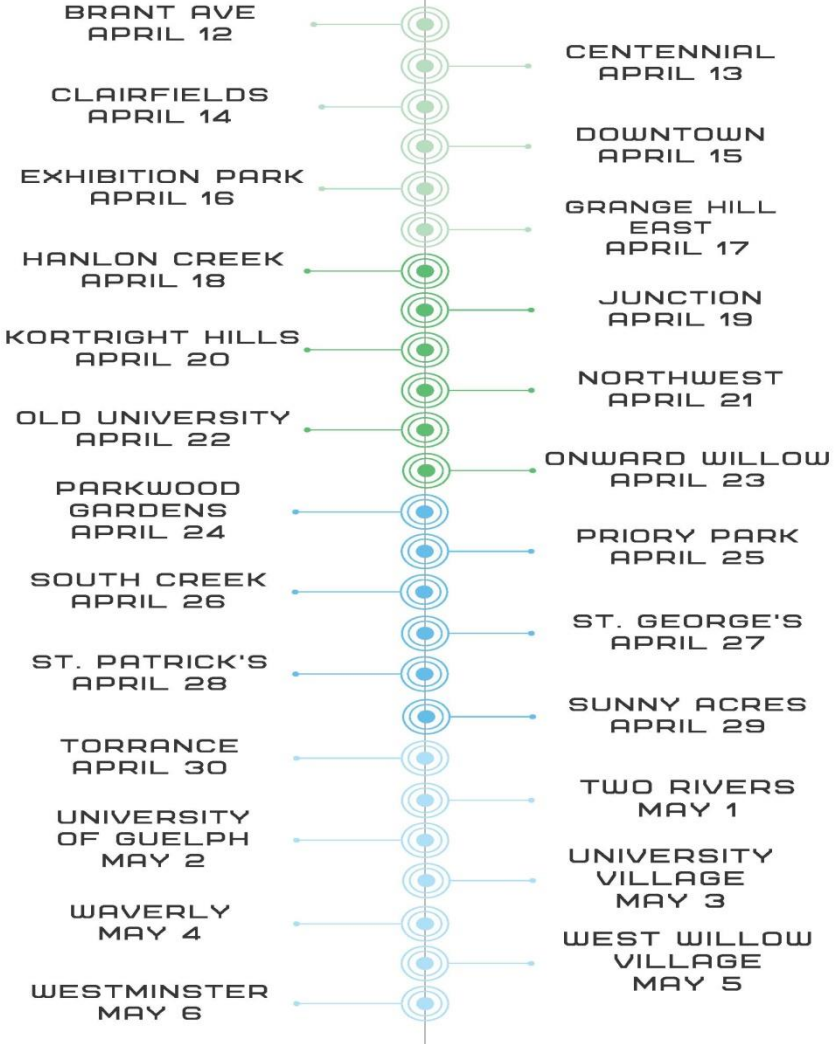
Specifically, we need the congregation to:

- 2. How should we view God’s command for change in our lives? Is this an act of love or dictatorship? Are God’s commands reasonable?**
